



CODE OF ETHICS

These articles have been adopted by the Modular Building Association of British Columbia (MBA) to promote and maintain high standards of professional service and ethical business conduct among members.

- A member shall deal fairly with customers, colleagues, fellow members and the general public
- A member shall conduct his or her professional life in accord with the interests of the MBA, the non-residential factory built modular building industry and the general public
- A member shall adhere to honesty and integrity and to generally held principles of professional conduct
- A member shall not engage in any practice which tends to corrupt the integrity of the MBA, the non-residential factory built modular building industry or process of government
- A member shall not intentionally misrepresent information concerning his or her financial and professional business background
- A member shall make proper, just and prompt payment for all contractual obligations
- A member shall abide by all lawful agreements to which he or she is a party, including all agreements with suppliers
- A member shall compete vigorously and fairly with other members
